11	COMES NOW Petitioner, State of Washington, by and through Robert W. Ferguson,	
12	Attorney General, and Colette Sampson and Kerry Werner, Assistant Attorneys General, and	
13	submits this petition seeking the involuntary civil commitment of the Respondent, Andrew Vejar,	
14	as a sexually violent predator pursuant to RCW 71.09 et seq. Specifically, the State alleges that	
15	Andrew Vejar is a sexually violent predator, as that term is defined in RCW 71.09.020(19), given	
16	the following:	
17	1. Respondent has been convicted of the following sexually violent offenses, as that	
18	term is defined in RCW 71.09.020(18):	
19	a) On or about December 14, 1999, in Pierce County, Washington,	
20	Respondent was convicted at trial of one count of Rape in the First Degree, one count of	
21	Attempted Rape in the First Degree, and one count of Kidnapping in the First Degree.	
22	Pursuant to RCW 71.09.020(18)(c), Petitioner will prove beyond a reasonable doubt at the	
23	civil commitment trial that the crime of Kidnapping in the First Degree was committed	
24	with sexual motivation. An element of the crime proven beyond a reasonable doubt at the	
25	criminal trial was that the defendant or an accomplice abducted that person with intent to	
26	facilitate the commission of rape.	

12.Respondent currently suffers from a mental abnormality as that term is defined in2RCW 71.09.020(9).

3. Respondent's mental abnormality causes him serious difficulty controlling his sexually violent behavior and makes him likely to engage in predatory acts of sexual violence if not confined to a secure facility.

4. Respondent has committed a recent overt act, as that term is defined in
RCW 71.09.020(13). On or about May 17, 2023, in the Pierce County Superior Court, Respondent
entered guilty pleas to three counts of Assault in the Fourth Degree and one count of Failure to
register as a Sex Offender, Cause No. 23-1-00344-8. The acts for which Respondent was convicted
constitute a recent overt act as a matter of law.

Based upon the foregoing, Respondent should be committed to the custody of the Department of Social and Health Services for placement into a secure facility for control, care, and treatment until such time as Respondent's condition has so changed that he no longer meets the definition of a sexually violent predator, or conditional release to a less restrictive alternative is in the best interest of Respondent and conditions can be imposed that would adequately protect the community.
