We continue to represent Crystal Bay Casino, located at 14 State Route 28, Crystal Bay, NV 89402, and write to supplement the notice provided to your Office on February 24, 2023. Our previous submission is attached here as *Exhibit AA*.

Based on ongoing efforts to reconcile data and determine contact information for individuals, beginning on March 28, 2023, Crystal Bay Casino provided notice to an additional two hundred two (202) Washington residents. In our previous submission to your office, we noted that Crystal Bay Casino notified one thousand two hundred seventy-eight (1,278) Washington residents regarding the incident, bringing the total number of Washington residents notified to date to one thousand four hundred eighty (1,480). The potentially affected personal information that was identified in relation to Washington residents includes name, social security number, driver's license number, and date of birth. As such, Crystal Bay Casino undertook a diligent review of the relevant file to determine what information was present and to whom it relates. On February 7, 2023, this review identified certain personal information was present in the relevant files. As this review was ongoing, on January 25, 2023, the investigation determined some database information may have also been copied from the system as part of the incident. The investigation further determined this copying activity occurred on or around November 27, 2022. Based on these findings, Crystal Bay Casino promptly reviewed the relevant database to identify what information was present, to whom that information related, and contact information for those individuals. Through its file and database reviews, Crystal Bay Casino determined the potentially affected information includes name, social security number, driver's license number, and date of birth.
