

Lakewood School District (“Lakewood”) identified and responded to a cybersecurity incident involving unauthorized access to its systems. In response, Lakewood took measures to secure its systems, engaged third-party cybersecurity firms to assist with an investigation, and notified the FBI. The investigation remains ongoing, but it was determined that an unauthorized actor accessed Lakewood’s network intermittently between March 19, 2026, and April 27, 2026, and obtained copies of certain files from its servers. On May 14, 2026, while in the process of reviewing these files, Lakewood identified a file or files containing the name and one or more of the following for 1,006 Washington residents: Social Security number, driver’s license number, and/or health savings account information.

On May 29, 2026, Lakewood sent notification letters via U.S. First-Class mail to the Washington residents. A copy of the notification letter is enclosed. Lakewood is offering the notified residents one year of complimentary credit monitoring and identity theft restoration services through Experian. Lakewood has also established a toll-free call center to answer questions notified individuals may have.

To prevent a similar incident from occurring in the future, Lakewood has implemented additional measures to enhance its existing network security.

Our district understands the importance of protecting the information we maintain. We are writing to notify you of a data security incident that involved some of your information. Our goal in this letter is to provide an overview of what occurred, our response, and possible next steps you may consider taking.

On April 27, 2026, we identified and responded to a cybersecurity incident involving unauthorized access to our systems. In response, we took measures to secure our systems, engaged third-party cybersecurity firms to assist with an investigation, and notified the FBI. Our investigation remains ongoing, but we determined that an unauthorized actor accessed our network intermittently between March 19, 2026, and April 27, 2026, and obtained copies of certain files from our servers. On May 14, 2026, while in the process of reviewing these files, we identified a file(s) containing your name and Social Security number.

We want to assure you that we take this matter seriously. In addition, we are providing you with a pre-paid 12-month membership for credit monitoring and identity protection services through Experian. This service is completely free for you, and activating the product will not hurt your credit score. For more information on additional steps you can take in response to the incident, and instructions on how to activate your complimentary membership, please see the pages that follow this letter.

We regret any inconvenience or concern this incident may have caused you. To prevent a similar incident from occurring in the future, we have implemented additional measures to enhance our existing network security. We remind you it is always advisable to be vigilant for incidents of fraud or identity theft by reviewing your account statements and free credit reports for any unauthorized activity. You may obtain a copy of your credit report, free of charge, once every 12 months from each of the three nationwide credit reporting companies. If you believe you are the victim of identity theft or have reason to believe your personal information has been misused, you should immediately contact the Federal Trade Commission and/or the Attorney General's office in your state. You can obtain information from these sources about steps an individual can take to avoid identity theft as well as information about fraud alerts and security freezes. You should also contact your local law enforcement authorities and file a police report. Obtain a copy of the police report in case you are asked to provide copies to creditors to correct your records. Fraud Alerts and Credit or Security Freezes:

Fraud Alerts: There are two types of general fraud alerts you can place on your credit report to put your creditors on notice that you may be a victim of fraud—an initial alert and an extended alert. You may ask that an initial fraud alert be placed on your credit report if you suspect you have been, or are about to be, a victim of identity theft. An initial fraud alert stays on your credit report for one year. You may have an extended alert placed on your credit report if you have already been a victim of identity theft with the appropriate documentary proof. An extended fraud alert stays on your credit report for seven years.

To place a fraud alert on your credit reports, contact one of the nationwide credit bureaus. A fraud alert is free. The credit bureau you contact must tell the other two, and all three will place an alert on their versions of your report.

For those in the military who want to protect their credit while deployed, an Active Duty Military Fraud Alert lasts for one year and can be renewed for the length of your deployment. The credit bureaus will also take you off their marketing lists for pre-screened credit card offers for two years, unless you ask them not to.

Credit or Security Freezes: You have the right to put a credit freeze, also known as a security freeze, on your credit file, free of charge, which makes it more difficult for identity thieves to open new accounts in your name. That's because most creditors need to see your credit report before they approve a new account. If they can't see your report, they may not extend the credit.

How do I place a freeze on my credit reports? There is no fee to place or lift a security freeze. Unlike a fraud alert, you must separately place a security freeze on your credit file at each credit reporting company. You'll need to supply your name, address, date of birth, Social Security number and other personal information. After receiving your freeze request, each credit bureau will provide you with a unique PIN (personal identification number) or password. Keep the PIN or password in a safe place. You will need it if you choose to lift the freeze.

How do I lift a freeze? A freeze remains in place until you ask the credit bureau to temporarily lift it or remove it altogether. If the request is made online or by phone, a credit bureau must lift a freeze within one hour. If the request is made by mail, then the bureau must lift the freeze no later than three business days after getting your request.

If you opt for a temporary lift because you are applying for credit or a job, and you can find out which credit bureau the business will contact for your file, you can save some time by lifting the freeze only at that particular credit bureau. Otherwise, you need to make the request with all three credit bureaus.
