INCIDENT REPORT

NARRATIVE:

On 10/8/10 at 2309 hours I was working routine uniformed patrol in and for the Cities of Cle Elum, Roslyn, and South Cle Elum, duly appointed to enforce the laws therein. At that time Kittcom advised of an assault call in Roslyn and said the subjects were enroute to the Cle Elum Urgent Care Center. The call stated men at the location given, an approximate address of 203 N "C" Street in Roslyn, were giving drugs/rufies to women at the party.

The call said a female with the reporting party was passed out in the back seat.

The call further stated a second friend had a bloody nose because he was hit in the face by an unknown male. The call said that the RP, [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]), was advising that possibly 6-8 others were passed out with overdoses at the residence in Roslyn.

Sgt. Moore, Cpl. Bland, and I all responded to the call. We went to the Urgent Care Center to meet the RP but we were advised that the RP was now parked in front of the Safeway. Medics also responded to the scene. Upon arrival, I made contact with the subject with the bloody nose. I later identified this male as, [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] told me that he was at a party in Roslyn, it became obvious that some girls had been drugged, a verbal confrontation about the drugging ensued, and then he was "blind-sided" and punched in the face. [REDACTED] said his nose began to bleed and it hurt when he was hit. [REDACTED] said he didn't know who punched him but said [REDACTED] knew who hit him. [REDACTED] was the driver of the vehicle who brought all the subjects to Safeway. Due to asking more questions about the welfare of the others at the house, I did not get to ask [REDACTED] about the assault and who hit [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] stated he and his friends loaded up one of the girls who had been drugged, and drove to Cle Elum to seek medical attention for her. This girl was later identified as [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] was assisted out of the vehicle. [REDACTED] body was very limp and even when taken out of the car she did not put her legs underneath herself to stand. [REDACTED] eyes were closed and she did not respond when people touched her and talked to her. [REDACTED] was immediately placed on a gurney to be transported to

the hospital.

Sgt. Moore requested more ambulance and medic units be dispatched to Roslyn to stage for more victims. Sgt. Moore, Cpl. Bland, Deputy Fletcher, Deputy Houseberg, Deputy Sinclair, and myself all responded to the area of "C" street and Washington Avenue in Roslyn, where the house party was located. Upon arrival, we observed a large house full of individuals. The address was later confirmed to be 309 E Washington Avenue in Roslyn.

Sgt. Moore and Cpl. Bland went to the front door area. Deputy Fletcher and I went to the backyard area. While going to the backyard area, I looked through the window to the basement and saw multiple females laying on the bed and they did not appear to be awake. I found three subjects in the backyard. One male could barely stand and appeared very intoxicated. I had the other two subjects assist the third subject in walking back to the front door area of the house. The living room area on the middle floor of the house became the staging area for all the subjects so they could be identified and be triaged for medical treatment.

I observed subjects either walking or running from the residence. I went towards the church at "B" Street and Idaho Ave and observed about a dozen cars parked in the lot on the south side of the church. I started shining my flashlights in the cars to see if there were any more subjects needing medical treatment. In one vehicle I located three subjects inside. There were two males in the car and female who appeared to be passed out.

I had the subjects exit the vehicle. The female had sweaty hair and her make-up was running down her face. The female was not alert. I called for an ambulance to come to my location to assess the female, later identified as [REDACTED]. I was told that [REDACTED] only had one drink tonight. As [REDACTED] stood in the fresh air, she became more alert. [REDACTED] informed me that she had only one drink tonight and it was called a "Four Loko". She was transported back to the house to go through the triage process with the rest of the patients. I walked the males back to the house to the main floor to await further instructions/treatment.

I went into the house and began obtaining identifications on all the subjects in the house. I also photographed the house. I observed a lot of empty beer cans, empty energy drink cans, bottles of hard liquor, and plastic cups filled with clear and amber colored liquids. I also observed large 24 ounce cans of an alcoholic drink called "Four Loko". There was also a flat surface like a table set up near the kitchen with plastic cups arranged in a pattern as if the

subjects were playing "beer pong".

I went upstairs to take photographs and Deputy Sinclair was watching over a male subject who was handcuffed in an upstairs bedroom. I was told that a sexual assault had possibly occurred in the room and that this was suspect. The male subject was not entirely cooperative and did not want to give his name to us. Eventually, the male identified himself verbally to me as, [REDACTED], and told me he is a CWU student and lives in Sparks Hall, Room [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me that he was having sex with his girlfriend, [REDACTED] and that she was from Richland, WA.

Deputy Houseberg then moved [REDACTED] to a different room and took his clothes as evidence. I stood by in the original bedroom and secured it so that no one entered it. I provided Deputy Houseberg with some evidence packaging supplies and he collected all the evidence. I photographed the room prior to Deputy Houseberg taking any of the items as evidence.

While the room was being searched for evidence, I also stood by and spoke with the person responsible for the house, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] never restricted consent to search the room nor stopped the search for evidence. [REDACTED] was cooperative and was grateful that police came and stopped the party.

I was instructed by Sgt. Moore to pour out all the alcohol in the residence. Ofc. Albo assisted me with this task. We poured all the alcohol out down the kitchen sink and placed the empty containers in the sink and on the kitchen counter.

While upstairs I noticed that there were several backpacks and duffel bags. I asked the group of subjects in the living room if any of the items upstairs were theirs and some of them said yes. I took the subjects upstairs to retrieve their items. I had the subjects open their backpacks and remove any alcohol inside. The subjects willingly gave up their alcohol and I took possession of it. I took this alcohol and poured it out in the kitchen sink.

All parties that displayed symptoms of poisoning and that required transport to the hospital were taken there by ambulance. There were some subjects that had not been drinking and they were allowed to drive themselves home from the party but they were not allowed to have any passengers with them. All the other party-goers that had alcohol in their system were provided transport back to the CWU campus by CWU Police and KCSO jail staff. Only three subjects stayed at the house and that was with the permission and approval of [REDACTED].

After all the students were transported home, we cleared the scene. This concludes my involvement in this case. All photos taken are attached to this report in Spillman. All other notes were transferred over to Ofc. Potter for him to continue the investigation.

CRIME: Poisoning / Overdose

NARRATIVE:

On October 8, 2010 while on routine uniformed patrol in and for the Cities of Cle Elum, Roslyn and South Cle Elum I responded to the area of the Safeway store to contact subjects in a tan Kia that were driving from Roslyn. The subjects in the vehicle were reporting that a male subject with them, [REDACTED], had been punched in the face and that a female subject, [REDACTED], was passed out in the back seat and that they believed she had been drugged at the party. The subjects reported that they had just left a large party on North C Street in the City of Roslyn.

As I pulled into the Safeway parking lot I observed that Cpl. Bland was out with the vehicle and that the medic unit and Aid car from Cle Elum Fire Dept were arriving. I observed a male and female subject walking from the vehicle towards Safeway. I contacted these two and identified them as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated that they had been at this large party in Roslyn and that they had watched [REDACTED] drink two shots of vodka and that [REDACTED] the passed out.

They advised that several other females were also passed out and in the same condition as [REDACTED] and that they had helped move those females to a bed in the basement of the house and that they felt the girls had been drugged with "roofies". When they started yelling that the girls had been drugged with roofies and were trying to get [REDACTED] out of the house and into the car to get her to medical care, an unknown male subject punched [REDACTED] in the nose and face.

[REDACTED] was being treated in the medic unit and I checked in the with paramedic working on her who advised that her condition was critical and that he believed she was under the influence of some kind of narcotic based on her very constricted pupils and that she had some reaction to the drug Narcan.

Based on the possibility of multiple other overdose victims, I requested that

EMS units be dispatched from Kittitas Valley Fire and Rescue, Cle Elum Fire Dept, Roslyn Fire Dept and Kittitas County Fire District 7 and that they all stage either at Roslyn Fire Station or Station 76 near Roslyn.

I asked [REDACTED] how they learned of the party in Roslyn and she said that they were students at CWU and that they had received a text message about the party with directions to the house. [REDACTED] showed me the text message that she had on her phone. The text gave directions to take I-90 to Exit 80 and then to go into Roslyn and turn right on Washington Avenue and go two blocks and turn left onto North C Street and that the party was at the first house on the left which is red with green trim on it.

Officer Rogers, Cpl. Bland, Deputy Houseberg, Deputy Fletcher and myself all cleared Safeway and responded to the residence in the City of Roslyn which was located at 309 East Washington Avenue. Upon arriving at the residence it was obvious that a very large party was going on and people started to run from the house and yard as we drove up to the house. Some people ran in the front door of the house and shut it locking the door. I knocked on the front door and yelled "Police" and for them to open the door. There were people visible directly inside the door, but they did not open the door.

Based on the exigency of the situation and grave medical condition that the girls inside were reported to be in and the fact that the initial report to Kittcom stated that several subjects were fighting in the residence, I kicked the front door open and made entry with Cpl. Bland directly behind me. As I entered the main room of the house I could see that the entire house was full of people that appeared to be underage and the house smelled of intoxicants and various forms of alcohol were visible all over the house.

I immediately yelled for them to show me where the sick girls were and how to get to the basement and a young male subject that was later identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED], showed me and Cpl. Bland to the basement. [REDACTED] was later identified as being the responsible person for the residence. He stated that the residence is owned by his parents and is a second home. [REDACTED] stated that the party was originally supposed to be for about 15 of his friends, but the party soon got out of control and many people showed up that he did not know and that many people had already left or fled upon the police arrival.

Upon getting into the basement there was a mattress on the floor and three girls were laying on the bed and appeared to be in serious medical distress. There were three males with the girls and they appeared to be trying to care for them. Behind the stairs in what appeared to be a framed in bathroom was a girl laying

on the floor and a male subject that had been with her. There were other subjects walking around the basement and we directed everyone that was able to and not caring for someone to go up stairs to the main room.

I then went back upstairs to the main floor and went outside and requested that Medical Command contact me so I could advise what we had for patients and where they were located at in the house. I then went upstairs and observed Deputy Houseberg in the bedroom to the left of the stairs and I went to the bedroom to the right. Deputy Houseberg advised that he had one in custody for sexual assault and I observed a male subject on the floor and a female subject that appeared extremely intoxicated and under the influence of some sort of substance in her bra and attempting to put on her underwear as she was naked except for a bra.

I went to the bedroom located to the right and found approximately 5-6 more subjects hiding behind a small doorway in the attic area above the eaves of the house. I had these people all go down to the main floor and then continued to search around the house for additional people. I spoke with [REDACTED] and explained to him that we were greatly concerned for the safety of the people that appeared to have been drugged and explained his Ferrier Warnings to him and asked for permission to search the residence for any kind of drugs that could have been used against the people. [REDACTED] consented to the search and appeared to have great concern for the people in distress and was very cooperative in assisting us in trying to find out what they had taken.

While conducting a secondary search of the basement, I located two more male subjects that had hidden under a large pile of fiberglass batt insulation. I had these two go upstairs and join the rest of the people in the main room. By this time I had requested that Officer Albo be called out from his residence to assist and he had arrived on scene.

I directed Officers Albo and Rogers to start assisting Cpl. Bland in gathering names and information from all the subjects in the house and I started to ask people if anyone knew anything about what the people that were being transported by ambulance had been given. Most people stated that they didn't know anything about what happened. Some people said that they had been told to not "use the red cups" and that a some vodka may have been spiked with roofies and given to the people that were sick. We were unable to locate any signs of drugs in the residence. The ratio of red to blue cups appeared to be about 5 to 1 and many people had been using the red cups that did not get sick.

As Cpl. Bland gathered names and information from people, I requested that fire

and EMS start exterior searches of the area to ensure that we didn't have any sick people that had run away from the house and needed treatment. Officer Rogers and Deputy McKean both ended up finding additional subjects from the party that were in the Catholic Church parking lot approximately one block away.

The church parking lot and surrounding area is where most of the people at the party had parked their vehicles.

Cpl. Bland advised that we appeared to be missing two females that were supposed to be at the party. These two females were eventually found in the bathtub of the main bathroom under some plywood and building materials. One of these girls had been vomiting and was treated and transported to KVCH by EMS.

Once EMS had treated all the patients at the scene, we started to deal with how to get all of these people back to CWU. Cpl. Bland had contacted Lt. Berthon-Koch at CWUPD and Lt. Berthon-Koch advised that he would be bringing some vans up from CWU to transport the students back to campus so that we didn't have them attempting to drive back to Ellensburg from Roslyn. Any of the subjects that blew a .000 on the PBT were allowed to leave and drive away, but only those people that blew a .000 were allowed to leave.

Once the vans from CWU and Corrections arrived, they transported 27 people back to Ellensburg and [REDACTED] and two of his friends were left at the house. Deputy Foster had travelled to KVCH and started to gather evidence and information on the victims that were transported there for us. Officer Albo went to KVCH to get more information.

Deputy Houseberg handled the possible sexual assault case and related evidence items. Investigation into the sexual assault to be completed by KCSO. Investigation into the possible drugging of the victims to be completed by CEPD, KCSO and CWUPD.

Investigation still open

red cup. She also thought that [REDACTED] had put down her drink cup in the kitchen and walked outside for a minute. She then returned to the cup and began to drink from it again. She also thought there was a bottle of vodka being passed around. She said that she didn't get sick because all she drank was 2 Coronas that she had brought to the party and she never left her drinks unattended.

I then checked on the status of [REDACTED] who had been placed in the ambulance and the medic told me that she was in serious condition and they would be responding priority to the hospital. I advised Sgt Moore of what I had been told and it was decided to respond to the Roslyn residence ASAP to locate the other possibly critical patients. Sgt Moore called Kittcom to ready several ambulances and medical personnel to stage at the Roslyn Fire Dept. Sgt Moore, Ofc Rogers, Dep Houseberg, and Dep Fletcher then detailed to 309 E Washington, Roslyn.

Upon arrival at the residence I saw several teenage looking kids in the yard as I made my way to the front door with Sgt Moore. I yelled at them if they owned the house, but they did not answer and ran away. Sgt Moore had been pounding on the door and I could see people just inside the door not responding to Sgt Moore. Sgt Moore then made entry and I went in behind him. We started yelling to the crowd of teenagers asking where the sick girls were. One male, later identified as the homeowners' son, [REDACTED], advised the girls were down in the basement and he led us to the basement. [REDACTED] was obviously scared and concerned about the sick girls and provided his full cooperation.

I went downstairs and the first thing I noticed on the floor to my left at the bottom of the stairs was a mattress that had 2 males sitting on it and they were comforting 2 females that were laying down. A third male was sitting at the end of the mattress and was holding up a female. These girls were unresponsive so I called for aid to come to the basement for 3 patients. I then saw around the corner of the unfinished basement a girl laying on the floor and a male immediately got up from laying behind her. He then walked away and left the female. He was adjusting his pants as he got up and I initially felt that he was putting his pants back on. When I noticed that the female laying on the floor did not respond, I grabbed the male to identify him and walk him back to the female. She immediately started to respond to me and told me that her name was [REDACTED] and she was fine. I noticed that her clothing was intact and she told me nothing had happened. The male was [REDACTED]. I told these two to go upstairs to contact officers. They then left the basement. I went back to check on the females on the mattresses and I spoke to the male sitting at the end of the mattress and identified him as [REDACTED]. He didn't know the female he was assisting and she was so drugged that she could not respond to my questions.

A name that she provided, but was unclear due to her severely slurred language was [REDACTED] and she started to give me a date of birth of [REDACTED]. She may reside at Beck Hall [REDACTED], but that was not confirmed. She became uncooperative and started to go upstairs. I told [REDACTED] that medics were upstairs and to escort her there. She started up the stairs and I had [REDACTED] go with her to ensure that she was seen by medics. [REDACTED] appeared to be sober.

I then talked to the two males sitting on the mattress. One identified himself as [REDACTED]. His full name was [REDACTED] from Beck Hall [REDACTED]. He didn't know the girl he was caring for, but was able to get her name as [REDACTED] and she lived in Kamola Hall at CWU. [REDACTED] did not know what she ingested and she was almost in the same condition that [REDACTED] had been at the Safeway. I then talked to the other male who identified himself as [REDACTED] from Meisner Hall, but he didn't know his room number. He told me that he didn't know the girl he was caring for. Medics then came down to the basement and were directed to the girl with [REDACTED] since she was in the worst condition. This girl and [REDACTED] were transported to the hospital.

I went upstairs to try and locate the blonde girl with [REDACTED] and I saw that the girl was sitting outside the door and was being tended to by Debbie Losse, KCFD Dist #7 EMT. This girl was also transported via ambulance. At this point I assisted in searching the rest of the house for any other sick persons with medics. After several patients had been located and cared for I began to look for the cause of the illness. I did not see any drug paraphernalia in the household. I did notice countless red and blue plastic cups, beer bottles, hard alcohol bottles, water bottles and other garbage throughout the residence. I also noticed several piles of vomit in every room, on beds, etc. By this time the occupants had all sat down in the main living rooms on the main floor of the residence. I was advised that Dep Houseberg had discovered a possible sexual assault in progress upstairs and that he had detained the male. I was told that Dep Houseberg would be handling that assault.

I then started to gather names in the downstairs room that had a foosball table in. I gathered numerous names of the people sitting in this room. While I was speaking to each of them I was checking to make sure of their level of consciousness. Even though most of them had been drinking, I did not locate any more seriously intoxicated people. I asked each of them what they had to drink and if they knew anything about what the sick people had drank. The general consensus that I had from these people was that they heard rumors that the sick girls' drinks had rufies added to them. No one could tell me where the rufies came from or who put them into drinks. I was told that some girls were told to

stay away from the red cups. Most of the people that I talked to that said they were not experiencing any ill side effects had brought their own alcohol and had opened the factory seal from whatever container it had come in. They also said that they never left their drinks unattended.

Ofc Albo and Ofc Rogers were also inside the house gathering names of people in other rooms of the house. Once all of the names were obtained, emergency responders had been directed to conduct a search of the surrounding area for any persons that may have walked away from the party. I later heard contacts with people that had been attending this party were found in the Catholic Church parking lot. I then asked Ofc Albo to talk with the people he had gotten names from to make sure all of them and their friends were accounted for, while I did the same with the people I had contacted. I asked Ofc Rogers to start taking pictures of the scene. We learned that two girls were unaccounted for, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. A more thorough search was conducted on the main floor. I was aware already that some kids had been found hiding in the attic crawl space, some under batts of insulation, and other odd locations. In the bathroom off of the master bedroom there was a bathtub that was made into a tabletop by placing a piece of plywood on it. Upon looking under the plywood, both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were located. [REDACTED] was transported by ambulance for her symptoms.

A count of the people that we had left at the house was 31 CWU students. I contacted CWU PD Lt Koch and he made arrangements for vans to come to Roslyn to pick up the students and take them back to Ellensburg. I then went to CEPD to assist Dep Houseberg with his interview from the sexual assault investigation. I turned on the video equipment for him while he and Dep Sinclair conducted the interview. I entered the names of the people that I contacted into Spillman and added them to the report.

On 10/08/10 at approximately 2353 hours, I was contacted by Kittcom to respond to 309 E Washington in Roslyn to a multiple drug overdose call. I arrived on scene at approximately 0005.

Upon arrival I saw multiple medic and police vehicles leading to the residence. I found Sgt. Moore who told me to start interviewing people to get names and addresses, also find out if anyone knew anything about drugs being put into drinks.

I spoke with a several people that were all cooperative. Each person provided me with a name, date of birth, address, and phone number. None of the people I spoke with knew anything about drugs being placed in drinks. I did hear the same story several times of a rumor that no one should drink out of the plastic cups. No one knew the source of the rumor or who they heard it from, just to stay away from the plastic cups.

After interviewing the subjects, I went around the room to find out if everyone was accounted for. I asked each subject to tell me who they came with, and point them out to me. In talking with the subjects there was a female subject that had not been accounted for. After searching I found the female in the bathtub with a piece of plywood covering her. The female subject was covered in vomit and did not look healthy. I called for medics to check on the subject, and she was transported to the hospital. After finding the female, each subject that I talked to had accounted for each person they arrived with to the party.

After I was done speaking with the subjects, I assisted in taking pictures of the downstairs basement area. In the photographs were pictures of a mattress with vomit on it, clothes with vomit on it, multiple bottles of alcohol, and several plastic cups.

I helped Officer Rogers find alcohol containers and poured the liquor down the kitchen drain.

I then assisted CWU Police in identifying the subjects as they were being loaded into the vans to be transported to the CWU campus.

After leaving the residence, I transported a male subject from the office to his residence in Sparks Hall at CWU. The subject I transported was at the Cle Elum Police Station where he had been interviewed.

After dropping the subject off I detailed to KVCH to identify all of the subjects that had been transported to the hospital whether it was via ambulance or personal vehicle. I identified [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] that were both in the ICU when I arrived to KVCH. I also spoke with [REDACTED] who was in a patient room in the E.R. I also saw [REDACTED] who was in a patient room in the E.R. Between Deputy Foster, myself, and a nurse at the E.R. Desk I found that [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] were seen at KVCH. The nurse could not confirm which patients were transported via ambulance as they were coming in so fast. I was able to find that [REDACTED] was seen at KVCH and arrived in his own vehicle. Deputy Foster was also able to find the name of [REDACTED] who was transported to a Yakima hospital from the scene.

On 10/12/10 at approximately 2130 hours while on uniformed patrol for the Cle Elum Roslyn Police Department, Kittcom advised of an informational report of the incident.

[REDACTED] told me his friend had information about who may have sold the drugs to the person at the party. [REDACTED] advised me his friend was with him, so I spoke with her directly.

[REDACTED] told me that she was a CWU student and was at the party. [REDACTED] said that earlier at approximately 1330 hours, she was at swimming class at CWU. [REDACTED] said she mentioned that she was at the party to some people in her class. When [REDACTED] mentioned that, she said a fellow student named [REDACTED] laughed.

[REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] what was so funny. [REDACTED] said that he knew the person that sold the drugs to the person that took them to the party. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] to tell her who did it because it was a big deal. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] wouldn't tell her and said, "the cops are going to find out on their

own." [REDACTED] again asked who the person was, and again he wouldn't tell her.

[REDACTED] said that later she called [REDACTED] to see if he would tell who the person was. [REDACTED] again said he wouldn't tell her and the cops would have to find out on their own eventually.

[REDACTED] said that later [REDACTED] sent her a lengthy text message saying that he knew who the person was and he wasn't going to tell anybody. I advised [REDACTED] to save the text message.

Arrangments were made for [REDACTED] to speak with Officer Potter on 10/13/10 at 1400 hours at the CWU Police Station.

On October 8, 2010 Cle Elum P.D. had a large number of overdoses at a party in Roslyn. Approximately fifteen subjects were transported to hospitals in the area.

On October 9, 2010 at approximately 0145 hours, Deputy Foster requested assistance in identifying a female at KVCH who had been transported from the incident in Roslyn. Deputy Foster advised the female was believed to be [REDACTED] but could not confirm as she was unconscious in CCU. Deputy Foster requested an attempt to locate a picture of [REDACTED] and emergency contact information due to her condition. Deputy Foster stated that [REDACTED] was believed to be a CWU student that lived at [REDACTED]

I contacted on-call RHC Ian Miller. Miller advised that the emergency contact cards were in the office of [REDACTED]. Miller also said that they had just added pictures in their system of the residents. I located [REDACTED] emergency contact card and obtained picture of [REDACTED] from Miller to take to KVCH to positively identify [REDACTED]

I went to KVCH and verified [REDACTED] identity with the photo provided by Miller. [REDACTED] was in a medically induced coma in CCU. I provided the hospital staff with [REDACTED] emergency contact information.

I contacted Deputy Foster who then contacted Sergeant Moore of Cle Elum PD. Sgt Moore requested I attempt to notify [REDACTED] parents.

After several numbers and assistance from [REDACTED] friends, I was able to contact [REDACTED]. I advised [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] basic condition. The doctor in the CCU then spoke to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised that she would be en route to Ellensburg.

A second CWU student, [REDACTED], was taken to CCU that had also been transported from the incident in Roslyn.

I was able to locate [REDACTED] parent information, which was given to the staff at KVCH's CCU. [REDACTED] was somewhat conscious according to staff, and they advised that they would wait to contact parents if needed.

I contacted [REDACTED] boyfriend, roommate [REDACTED], and friend [REDACTED]

in the lobby of KVCH. They were extremely distraught. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had been [REDACTED] at the party in Roslyn. They both believed that [REDACTED] had been "Ruffied." [REDACTED] boyfriend was allowed into CCU as he was listed as her emergency contact. I transported [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]s to [REDACTED] from KVCH after they spoke to a Cle Elum police Officer.

Supplemental Report

On October 9, 2010 at approximately 1300 hours I went to KVCH to conduct an interview with [REDACTED], who was awake and off the respirator. [REDACTED] was in CCU, where I conducted a taped interview.

[REDACTED] said that she was invited to go to the party by her roommate, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that the party was at a residence in Roslyn, owned by [REDACTED] family. [REDACTED] was having the party, referred to as a "Cabin Party". [REDACTED] was described as being [REDACTED] roommate.

[REDACTED] said that she drove to the party by following [REDACTED] as she did not know how to get to the party. [REDACTED] rode with [REDACTED] to the party. [REDACTED] arrived at the party around 9 pm. [REDACTED] said that she was with [REDACTED] at the party.

While at the party [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] to have some of his Monarch brand vodka. [REDACTED] was described as being one of [REDACTED] friends from high school and lives on campus. [REDACTED] watched [REDACTED] pour the vodka into two blue Dixie cups. [REDACTED] gave [REDACTED] one cup and kept one for herself. [REDACTED] stated that she drank the vodka slowly.

[REDACTED] described how much vodka was in the cup. Staff from KVCH assisted me with putting water into a similar size cup to the level that [REDACTED] said was accurate. The water was then measured and it equaled approximately one and a half shots.

[REDACTED] then saw [REDACTED] (unknown last) at the party drinking from a Captain Morgan rum bottle. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if they could have some of the rum. [REDACTED] again poured the rum into the Dixie cups to approximately the same level that she had poured the vodka earlier. [REDACTED] reportedly mixed diet coke with the rum while [REDACTED] drank it straight.

[REDACTED] then went outside the residence to smoke marijuana with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] possibly from [REDACTED]. While sitting outside [REDACTED] saw [REDACTED] walk outside and begin vomiting. [REDACTED] went to check on [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] had someone else attending to him, so [REDACTED] went back to talking to her friends.

[REDACTED] then began talking to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said that she began getting "fuzzy". Talking to [REDACTED] on the steps outside the residence was the last memory [REDACTED]

had until she woke up in the hospital at 0900 hours on 10/09/2010.

██████ did not think that she had been sexually assaulted, but said she could not be sure. I asked ██████ if she wanted to speak to an ASPEN advocate and she said that she did. I contacted ASPEN and an advocate, Katie, arrived a short time later at KVCH.

I spoke to ██████ about counseling services available through CWU, while waiting for ASPEN to arrive.

I left KVCH, with ██████ talking to ASPEN.

I contacted Officer Potter at Cle Elum PD, and advised him that I had conducted the interview.

I advised ██████ mother where ██████ had left her parked car, the Catholic Church in Roslyn.
